It can be painful for us to think that our actions can be the cause of harm for ourselves or someone else. Our thoughts and desires can be the cause of pain. I am someone who likes to please people. I love nothing more than to make people happy or bring a smile to their face. The idea that I can bring pain in this world is hard for me to wrap my head around. This is what we are faced with as we face Lent. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th, which we will celebrate with Lawrence Chapel that night.

Individuals and teams from within and outside of the state have been working for more than two years helping families whose homes were devastated by the historic flooding of 2015, Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and Irma in 2017. These efforts go on year round. Mt. Zion member Sharon Miller joined a team in Georgetown, SC for three days in early January replacing flooring in a mobile home. The group of 20 was from First United Methodist Church in Chambersburg, PA. They were housed at Trinity UMC in Andrews, SC. Teams of 2-5 were repairing and/or rebuilding in three counties. A range of skills are needed, especially construction. Sharon was mainly a "gofor", but also carried trash and swept. In the photos here you see a bedroom floor after removing the old flooring and her delivering sections of tile to hose laying it. A corner of the new floor is to her right.

We are entering a 40 day period of self-examination where we take a hard look at our life. At lease that is the call for us. Many of us will give up something for Lent or we will try to take time to focus more on God. Ash Wednesday is a reminder for us of our brokenness of our humanity. It is a reminder that our will does not always coincide with the intentional will of God. We are meant to spend time in preparation for Easter to remember that we are broken, to remember that sometimes we allow evil to win, to remember that we fall short of the mark God sets for us, to remember we sin. We should take a look at our lives and see where our sin is, admit where it is, and then begin to work on

conforming our will more to God's intentional will.

Lent does not end there though, just as God's will does not end with just intention. God's will ends with resurrection, with the ultimate will of God, which is reconciliation. It is my hope that our journey in Lent begins with understanding how we fall short of the intentional will of God, but that we end with celebrating that God is always at work and that God's ultimate will can and will still be accomplished.
