Pastor Jim's W.I.R.E.D. Thoughts

I'm not sure about you, but I don't typically like new beginnings. Once I'm into "the beginning" I start to be OK with it; but at the beginning of the new beginning, it has a way of wigging me out (that means, I can get pretty stressed). I doubt I'm the only one that tends to have that reaction.

We all are faced with new beginnings constantly in our lives. We even make a big deal every year about having "a new beginning" with the New Year; but, in truth, there really isn't anything physically new about going from one year to another, from moving out of 2013 into 2014. But, emotionally and spiritually, it can have a great deal of significance. A new year can serve as a new opportunity for us to decide to do some things differently, to make important changes in our lives, or our finances, or in the way we eat or live.

Truth is, everyday we have that opportunity to have a new beginning in our lives. That's what comes to my mind every time I read in Romans 12:1 about giving my-self as a "living and holy sacrifice" to God. A sacrifice is something you offer up, let go of, and, if it's "living," well then, it must be something more than once, right? To me, that means, a new beginning.

Scripture tells us that we are a new creation, the old has gone and the new has come, through Christ. A new beginning, a chance to start over, a chance to learn from our past and to make changes in the present so that we will live better in the future. As Christians, and a church, isn't that how we are to go about living our lives and functioning as a church, committed to allow Christ to "change" us and make us new? Isn't that one of the ways we glorify God and, in return, He brings glory to us? (See 1 Thessalonians 1:11-12)

Every time a church goes through the transition of getting a new pastor, they are given another opportunity to have a new beginning, to go deeper in allowing God to make changes and adjustments in how that church goes about bringing glory to God. And for the new pastor, well, trust me, it's a new beginning for him/her as well. Change is never easy, but usually (even most often) necessary for God to continue shaping his people so that they can better bring glory to Him.

As we move into 2014 and go on this journey together, let us determine and commit to one another that we will be open to God's leading as His people, and live for Him. As Paul put it: "So here's what I want you to do, God helping you: Take your everyday, ordinary life—your sleeping, eating, going-to-work, and walking-around life—and place it before God as an offering. Embracing what God does for you is the best thing you can do for Him. Don't become so well-adjusted to your culture that you fit into it without even thinking. Instead, fix your attention on God. You'll be changed from the inside out. Readily recognize what He wants from you, and quickly respond to it. Unlike the culture around you, always dragging you down to its level of immaturity, God brings the best out of you, develops well-formed maturity in you." (Rom 12:1-2, the Message)
