It is good at times to sit back and take stock of where you are in life and where you have been. I want to take that time now to look at where we are as a church and look back over where we have been in the past year. I have been here almost a year now and we have done a lot in that year.

One of the pieces of advice that pastors often get is to not change anything in a new appointment for 6 months and then do small things only for the first year. I think I blew that idea out of the water with the change in the sanctuary. We came together to improve and enhance the sanctuary and make it more accessible for people as well as more functional. I think we accomplished both things. In the midst of all of the construction some really great things happened. I have heard a lot of members talk about how they liked worshiping in the Fellowship Hall and how that intimate space made it feel like everyone was family. We also had the opportunity to do a worship service outside under the tent for Easter which is an experience I will never forget.

We took on a visioning process that left us with three goals to work on for the next 5 years. The first goal is to grow our Children's Program and double it in size over the next 5 years. In the past year we have enhanced our Children's Program and continue to develop it. We have a Children's Choir now that meets regularly and has sung for us twice in worship. We are starting to have monthly children's events that are hopefully going to help us draw in other children as well as continue to grow our own children. We are planning on starting a second Children's Sunday School class as well as a big Children's Day on August 27th.

The second goal for our congregation is to grow in missions especially in hands -on missions. Since my arrival last June we have been involved in supporting Salkehatchie and Clemson Wesley Foundation with meals.

From the Trustees

Much of what the trustees do is behind the scenes and often church members never realize their functions. What are a trustees' basic responsibilities?

- Oversee, maintain, and supervise church property
- Create and submit a report to the charge conference about the state of the church's property, equipment, and investments
- Receive and administer gifts made to the congregation and to make certain that all funds of the congregation are invested properly
- Ensure that the articles of incorporation are kept up-to-date
- Be responsible, in conjunction with the pastor, for all use of the church buildings and grounds
- Maintain adequate insurance coverage on all church property
- Submit to the committee on finance the annual budget requests for insurance, property maintenance and improvement
- Trustees are accountable to the charge conference and to the church council

As trustees, we must ensure that our facilities are accessible to all persons. The recent sanctuary remodeling project is an example of the Trustees, with input from the congregation, using a memorial gift to make our church more handicapped accessible. After all the work is completed, we should have approximately \$13,000 remaining in the Claud & Christine McAlister Memorial Fund.

Throughout 2015 and 2016, the trustees have been working to improve the energy efficiency of the church. In 2015 we added insulation in the attic over the sanctuary and installed remotely controlled programmable thermostats on all HVAC units in the church. In our 2016 budget, money was allocated to finish insulating the church attic, install a water heater timer, and install LED bulbs in the front porch lights. All of these changes will make a significant difference in our electric and gas bills. This is an example of being good stewards with God's money.

If you see anything at the Church that is broken or not working properly, please contact one of the Trustees so that these issues can be repaired in a timely manner.
