I will tell you I first fell in love with this story as a young child sitting in Sunday School and watching this story acted out on felt boards. On a side note, sometimes I think we need to bring felt boards back, they were amazing. I really thought the story was great because the names were cool. That was my first impression of the story. Obviously as I have grown, my understanding of the story has changed from it just being a story about some guys with cool names.

Just to set the stage for you, it is a story about Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego not being willing to worship the statue of King Nebuchadnezzar. They were being set up by some of the advisers of the king who were jealous of the three men. The rule was, you had to bow and worship the statue or be thrown into the fire. Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego decided they would not worship and were willing to die. When their time came to be thrown into the fire they made the fire so hot that one of the people heating up the fire died from exposure to the fire. When their fate was sealed, this is what they said:



### Dear Mt. Zion Family:

The Administrative Council would like to update you on where we are in respect to the McAlister Memorial Fund. As you know the majority of the fund was spent on the improvements to the front of the sanctuary.

In January, a proposal was brought by the Trustees to the Administrative Council to use the remaining money in the McAlister Memorial Fund, about thirteen thousand dollars, to build a handicapped bathroom. The proposal was met with a shortfall of seven thousand dollars in funding. In addition to the shortfall in funding, the new bathroom would take up part of the vital space in the main office area. The Council discussed this proposal and found it wise to pause and look at the overall needs of the church before moving ahead with the project.

The council voted to create a Long Range Planning Committee to look at the facility needs of the church for the ministries and goals that we have. The Long Range Planning Committee consisted of church members Drew Gelder, John Malmgren, Ginger Mullinax, Cathy O'Dell, John Wisham and nonvoting member Pastor Gene Aiken. This committee asked Cathy Joens, Anderson District Congregational Specialist, to help complete the task of setting goals for the church.

In their four meetings, the committee looked at the goals set by Administrative Council in 2016: to increase Children's Ministry participation, to increase missions participation, and to increase ministry participation. The church's progress was discussed on these goals. The next question the Long Range Planning Committee discussed is how we see ourselves as a church. The overwhelming answer was that we see ourselves as a large family. They discussed how our family is welcoming, always willing to help out, cares for one another, and cares for the community. The Committee also discussed some of the facility needs the church has.

With these discussions in mind the Long Range Planning Committee presented their findings and made a proposal to Administrative Council on May 7, 2017. The Administrative Council voted unanimously not to pursue a handicapped bathroom at this time, but to focus on some other needs of the church. The needs in order of priority are 1) a covered walkway for the back door of the church, 2) directional signage for inside and outside the church, and 3) a picnic pavilion for the field behind the church. Also, along with this proposal is the understanding there is a need for a cleanup day at the church to clear out some storage space. The Administrative Council has asked the Trustees to seek bids on the three priorities and come back to the Administrative Council with proposals for each project.

We hope that you will continue to pray along with us as we seek to continue to be good stewards of the gifts that God has provided for our church.
