When I was a teenager I did what many teenagers do: I decorated my bedroom by putting up posters. I remember two posters very well. One poster was Salvador Dali's depiction of the Last Supper. The second one was very colorful, referring to names from the Bible describing God and Jesus, like "Prince of Peace" and "Wonderful Counselor".

I recalled the latter poster when I recently preached a sermon from John's gospel in which Jesus referred to himself as the Good Shepherd. A Tribute to Lois Bomar

The following are excerpts from a tribute, *A Cake for Lois*, written by Elizabeth Finley and presented at the UMW Joint Meeting on March 24, 2012.

- Did you know that Lois was in charge of funeral meals for years and years? She planned, called, served, delivered and cleaned up the mess. She did it all!
- Her obituary didn't convey the real spirit of this dynamic woman. Many of you at Mount Zion, like me, knew her devoted spirit and feel the loss.
- Lois was a leader in our church. She was a loyal member to the Dolly Brock Circle. She led the women as our United Methodist Women President. She was once the Chairperson of the Administrative Council.
- Lois printed and folded the weekly church bulletin and mailed copies to our shut-ins.
- She helped with every meal in our kitchen. She tirelessly carried the heaviest tea pitchers ever refilling empty tea glasses. She just showed up ready to work!
- This past summer at Vacation Bible School, I watched as she swept spilled taco meat from under the tables of the kindergarten children. She was 80 years old.
- Singing the Alto parts in the choir was a jubilant joy for her with life-long friendships. Those same friends giggled and teased her for not wearing her hearing aids, often missing instructions and losing her place.
- Even before there was Clemson Community Care, there was Lois. She searched out the needy at school and from the Central Police. She organized a church group to make baskets of food including turkeys at Thanksgiving and Christmas. She delivered them.

Lois, like spilled honey, silently seeped into all our lives modeling the life of a dedicated Christian and her love for Jesus. Not looking to her own interests, but to the interests of others, Lois, we will forever be influenced by your sweet goodness.
