A mosquito net that covers a bed <u>that the entire family sleeps in costs</u> only \$10. A net for

two, \$5.50. One for a baby crib, \$3. A small contribution can make a world of difference. Be aware of future opportunities to raise the consciousness of our Central—Clemson community with informational brochures, *Imagine No Malaria* bracelets and temporary tattoos for the children.
