Why not the one that is coming in 2024 or 2045? Did you know that since 2000 there have been 11 total solar eclipses somewhere in the world? Was that God showing judgement on those areas that were in the path of totality? I keep seeing a post on Facebook that is associated with Anne Graham Lotz. I have no idea if it was originally hers, but it makes the case that because America had turned it's back on God then we are seeing all of this destruction. It hurts that people believe that God works that way.


Early Response Team (ERT) training opportunities

Join ERT and help people recover from disaster in SC. We are United Methodist Volunteers in South Carolina who are dedicated to showing the love of Jesus to others in the aftermath of a disaster.

We have teams and regional coordinators who cover our state from border to border. Our teams consist of 6-12 people. All members receive 8 hours of training in

basic disaster response, first aid and CPR. Additionally, trained personnel in chainsaw safety, CISM and EMS accompany each team.

Personnel are rotated in and out every 3 to 4 days due to the intense physical and mental stress associated with true disaster response.



More than 65 million people in the United States provide care for chronically ill, disabled or aged




family members or friends during any given year. That care is valued at \$375 billion a year, which is almost twice as much as is spent on homecare and nursing home services combined. (American Society on Aging)
