Pastor Jim's W.I.R.E.D. Thoughts

Someone mentioned to me the other day that, in writing this, I might want to share about why I do some of the things I do when I preach, kind of my philosophy on what makes me "me" as a preacher and worship leader. I thought that was a good idea, until I sat down and began to try to articulate the "whys" to such things. I wasn't sure just how many things might be involved! But let me address a couple.

Why do I wear an ivory robe instead of a black one?

Truth is, I'm not a robe wearer in general. Robes make me feel uncomfortable. If you haven't noticed, I tend to trip over them. But the robe I wear is called an alb, and it has its connection to the kind of robes that monks wore. Monks wore plain and simple robes so as not to draw attention to themselves. It was an expression of being a servant to the people. And I like that; I want to be a servant of Christ to people. Other robes, for me – and this is just my personal opinion – that have designs and colors and are ornate in style have a way of setting the wearer apart from others. That makes me uncomfortable. Plus, those robes tend to be heavy and hot, and I don't like to be hot! I admit that I am more comfortable in casual clothes or jeans than a suit or a fancy robe, which is why my wife often steps in and makes clothing choice suggestions for me!

Why do I come down to the floor and preach instead of staying behind the pulpit?

I like to move. I'm preaching God's truths and I get excited about what God wants us to discover and learn. I also like being on the same level as the congregation. I am part of this congregation, exercising my gifts amongst you, not above you. Plus, it allows me the opportunity to engage people on a more personal level, more conversational than lecture. At least, that is what I strive for.
