Many of you are helping with teaching children's Sunday School, our Tuesday night Bible study has grown to almost 10 people, attendance in the Adult Sunday School has risen, and we are doing some cleaning days in the near future. I wanted to mention all of this, to point out that we are on our way.



In the spirit of Christian love, the women and men of Mount Zion came together to help us sponsor a Valentine's Luncheon on Sunday, February 11, 2018. We had put out a call for "hearty" casseroles so that no one would go hungry, and my goodness, what we acquired from the members of the church was so bountiful that we could have fed twice as many people as we had attend!



Our **LOVE FOR ONE ANOTHER** produced five hams, countless casseroles of mac and

cheese, scalloped potatoes, baked spaghetti, deviled eggs, homemade bread, pound cakes, and congealed salads. We can't list them all because our memories have faded in time; but the essence or truth is that there was a **bountiful** feast!

The members of the church who attended also came across financially. We collected ~\$320 (with a little more promised) that will go directly to **missions**. When we say **"missions"** it is a general term that **covers so very much**.

"Missions" covers: the boxes that we purchase and assemble for Operation Christmas Child; the school supplies, notepads, crayons, glue sticks, scissors, rulers, pencils, small toys, and stuffed animals that we pack into 50 boxes; the emergency/health care kits we prepare for UMCOR (the United Methodist Committee on Relief); the money we send to UMCOR; the money we send to Meals on Wheels; the supplies we contribute to local flood relief; the gifts and clothing we buy for two Helping Hands children at Christmas; the money we give to orphanages like Epworth; and the money we give to the at-risk programs at Bethlehem-Columbia, Bethlehem-Spartanburg, Killingsworth, and the Wallace Family Life Center. The word "missions" covers so many things that it is hard to recall them all, but the effect of the money produces such joy and so much good!

The good things that you do have a positive effect upon other human beings. We thank you for all the love and gifts that you have bestowed upon so many!

I also say this to remind us that we are not there yet. We always have work to do. I was talking with a church member recently and mentioned that Clemson had done well in an ACC Championship. They told me that in sports the goal is not just to do well but to win championships. They then told me that they don't come to church to be part of a service that does well, but they come to be part of a championship service every week. This has stuck with me and has encouraged me in the last month or two to strive to do better. My hope is that we strive to do our best each and every week for God. My hope is that we are the kind of church where you want to invite others to come and be a part of the good that is going on here. It is my hope that we invite others into this relationship that we are building with Christ and with one another. It is my hope that we are church that is never satisfied with where we are but are always striving to reach for where God is leading us. May we always seek God in our journey together.
