In early May of this year, **Mount Zion's Time Capsule**, buried since 1989, received merciful release from a dark and wet grave. Despite water damage, most printed items contained in the capsule kept their identity. After a period of air drying, images on several pieces of crumpled, discolored paper were found to transfer nicely to smooth, clean paper through the magic of photocopying. It soon became clear that most contents of the capsule could be replicated either by photocopying or by substitution, as

in the case of the *United Methodist Women's Cookbook* which could be replaced with a duplicate from the Church Archives. The only items that could not be salvaged or replaced were an audiotape and a videotape of unknown contents, as well as photographs of the various Sunday School classes and the men's and women's organizations. These group photos had been placed in a small album. Fortunately, names written on the backs of the ruined photos remained readable and were photocopied and then transcribed. Older church picture directories show many individuals included in those groups.

The whole purpose of burying the Time Capsule back in 1989 was to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Mount Zion's earliest recorded Sunday School class in 1889. One objective of exhuming the capsule in this current

year was to display its contents during a special Homecoming event that was held on May 20, 2018. Those who viewed the display (now preserved in the Church Archives) may have sensed something of the spirit that has prevailed in Mount Zion's Sunday School and in its other groups for more than a hundred years.
