 have shared about this church.





Spreading the Word of God

The Easy Way

"The word "evangelism" sends a shiver down the spine of many Christians. I won't know what to say. I want to get to know the person better. They seem like they wouldn't be open to the gospel. Evangelism is not my spiritual gift." Does this sound familiar? If you feel that you are not equipped to spread the word of God, then I encourage you to think about some simple and easy ways that you might do so.

There are the traditional ways of encouraging someone to attend: a simple <u>invitation</u> to join us in worship or talking with your friends, neighbors, and coworkers about our worship service and how much you enjoyed the choir, the music, the message.

There are also **new** ways to share God's word as well. If you are using social media, which many of you are, then an **easy** way to spread God's word is through "**sharing**" on Facebook, Instagram, or Twitter. It is quite common to press the "like" button and a little more time consuming to post a comment, but the **brass ring** on Facebook is when you **share** a post. "**You are essentially saying** "all my friends have to see this!" This is huge in terms of exposure, word-of-mouth recommendation, and credibility.

As a church on Facebook we currently have 253 people who follow us. That's up 57 people from a year ago. Imagine what would happen if each of those 253 people **shared** just one of our posts with their friends!

Talk about spreading the word about God in an exponential fashion! You could share a post about our activities: the men's breakfast, the quarterly after-worship dinners, the UMW Valentine's luncheon, the movie night, the tailgate and water day, the blessing of the backpacks, and the Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes. You could share one of the posted Bible verses or photos of volunteers, children, and behind-the-scene activities occurring at the church. If God can speak through donkeys like He did in Numbers 22:28 (NIV) then sharing His news through Facebook should be no problem!

2019 South Carolina Annual Conference Report

I have been honored and privileged to attend the SC UMC Annual Conference in Greenville, SC for 2017, 2018, and 2019. The conference will now be moved back to Florence, SC beginning in June 2020.

First of all, let me say that we are extremely blessed to be led by Rev. Jonathan Holston (Bishop) and secretary Rev.

Ken Nelson. They keep the meeting on point and moving. The theme of this year's meeting was "A Future with Hope." Three petitions were to be voted on. However, all three were ruled out of order. Thus no petition or resolutions were passed this year. Two mission initiatives were worked on this year - 1) Native American older food baskets and 2) Harvest Food Bank of Greenville. Nineteen new men and women were commissioned and ordained as elders and deacons (clergy).

Perhaps the big highlight of this year's annual conference was the election of delegates to next year's General Conference (Minneapolis, Minnesota in May 2020) and the Jurisdictional (Southeast) Conference at Lake Junaluska. It will be a very important year at these conferences as the main topic will be LGBTQ issues.

Just a side note: I learned there are more than 230,000 United Methodists in South Carolina. We were blessed to have our beloved Malek McDuffie leading the singing on the opening night.


Lay Delegate
