It is hard to believe more than 3 months have passed since my family and I arrived here. In that time, we've done a lot together! In July, we met in people's homes so I could learn more about you and what is important to you. In August, I met with our Staff-Parish Relations Committee (SPRC) and Church Council to share what I learned and discern next steps to take together. Steps affirmed by Church Council were:

1. Visit Central Academy, our neighboring apartments, the fire and police stations, Central UMC, the Highway Patrol, and other neighbors to begin building relationships with them and explore how we can best partner together and support one another.

2. Leverage our proximity to Southern Wesleyan University (SWU) and Clemson (and our abundance of teachers and parent/grandparent-like figures) to have college intern(s) who would give support to children's and youth ministries and mentoring while gaining ministry experience in a nurturing, supportive environment.

3. Identify college students to sing in our choir to further enhance our worship, with the intent of having families "adopt" these students (and the intern students, too) to intentionally nurture them in their lives, career development, and faith journeys.

Everyone at our September quarterly meal heard about these steps and shared which steps they were most passionate about personally. Several church members have already made trips with me to visit community neighbors. In fact, you can read inside this newsletter about upcoming opportunities to connect with some of these neighbors.

I've also met with faculty from SWU about how we can partner together in a way that will allow this nurturing, family-like church to have the greatest impact possible on any college students, youth, and children who enter this sacred space. In the days ahead, I will be in conversation with SPRC, Finance, Church Council, and those who have expressed a passion in pursuing these steps to discern how to fund and carry out this important work. Thank you for your prayers and service as we live into this vision!

The Central Methodist church building erected at a cost of \$60,000, has recently been completed and services is one of the most handsome and attractive houses of worship to be found in this section of the state and compares with those to be found in the largest cities of the state.


