Throughout this season that has been impacted by COVID-19, I have continued to meet periodically online and through phone calls with our worship committee, lay leader (Benji Cumbie), church council chair (Ed Martin), and Staff-Parish chair (Kathy O'Brien). We have consistently reaffirmed our commitment to take each step toward in-person activities only once the virus has shown a decline in new cases in our area for a minimum of two weeks. Based on the latest local and statewide trends that we are monitoring, we anticipate taking that first step on August 30. We have been invited to participate in a prayer walk and outdoor service with Bethel, Central, and Lawrence Chapel UMCs that day, which you can read more about on page 4. Then, on September 6, we will try out an outdoor service in our parking lot at 9:30. Below are some helpful questions and answers as you prepare for those upcoming services:

Where do I park on September 6? Please enter the church parking lot from Church St. Hospitality team members will direct you where to park your car.

Can I get out of my car during the service? Yes! If you plan to get out of your car, please bring a chair so you can sit beside your car, more than 6 feet from other families. And if you get out of your car, you will also need to wear a mask.

What if I don't have a mask? A hospitality team member can give you one.

Do we get to sing together? Unfortunately, no. Even outdoors, <u>group singing increases the chance of spreading the virus</u>. We'll still have keyboard and solos.

How will we give our offering? You may continue giving online or by mailing a check to PO Box 186, Central, SC 29630. There will also be an offering box where you may place your offering as you exit the parking lot.

What if I have to go to the bathroom? The downstairs door will be unlocked so that you can use the restroom. Our "Potty Patrol" volunteers will make sure the bathroom gets cleaned between each user.

Is there a nursery? No. We encourage families to worship together!

When will we be able to receive Communion again? On September 6! You are invited to BYOB (bring your own bread) and grape juice. We will offer a blessing and share in the sacrament together that way.

What if I don't yet feel comfortable being around other people? It is perfectly okay to continue worshiping from home! We will continue posting the service online. The only difference is that it will be available at 9:30 beginning September 6, instead of 11. The same is true for those whose health makes it unsafe to be in a parking lot in the heat for an extended period of time.

What if it rains? In the event of rain, a message will be sent out on the One Call Now app, emailed, and posted to Facebook. In the event of bad weather, the service will be available online only. The time will still be 9:30.

What about Sunday school? Starting on September 6, and for the duration of our outdoor worship services, children's and youth Sunday school will meet virtually at 11.

Is this what worship will look like from now on? We don't know for sure. As we've all learned, new developments with the virus require new responses and plans. As we've shared repeatedly, this is a "holy experiment." You can find the most recent guidance from the SC UMC conference here. Thank you for the understanding and willingness to adapt that you have shown so far as we continue to make our way through this unprecedented season!

Thank you to the trustees for your work getting railings installed along the sides of the church building! They look great and will help keep our kids and neighbors from falling.







Tuesday evening opportunities!

about race. The Zoom ID is 832 4423 7038, and the Passcode is 871974. You can register your child here.


