



Friends,

As I have shared on several occasions in worship, there have been recent misleading news reports that The United Methodist Church has decided to separate. While there *are* five different plans for dividing or restructuring the denomination that have been proposed by various groups, the only body with the authority to make such decisions is the General Conference, which meets (usually) every four years. The next General Conference will take place May 5-15, 2020 in Minneapolis.

The reason for recent talk of a separation or restructuring is the UMC's longstanding disagreement about homosexuality, particularly with regard to marriage and ordination. I wish I could tell you what General Conference will likely decide, but I cannot. I wish I could tell you what The United Methodist Church will look like following General Conference, but I can't do that, either. What I *can* do is make sure we pray and prepare ourselves to be in ministry regardless of the Conference's decisions.

To this end, Mt. Zion's Staff-Parish Relations Committee will soon begin engaging in a process with one another for having difficult conversations about the issues that confront our denomination. After working through this process with that small group, everyone in the church will be invited to participate in a similar process so that we will all be better equipped to talk about our concerns and hopes in the midst of uncertain times.

The one thing we can always be certain of is God's presence with us and love for us. While there are many things we can't control, we can always control how we make God's presence real to the community around us. I leave you with words from Bishop Gary E. Mueller of the Arkansas Annual Conference, reminding us of what we mean to the community around us and what God has called us to do, regardless of what happens at General Conference in May:

"I love the United Methodist Church and the way of being Christian it shares. But ultimately, local congregations matter more than denominations – even our beloved United Methodist denomination. People need your local church, not a (continued on Page 2)

denomination. And most importantly, Jesus needs your local church, not a denomination....

Live out your purpose. Jesus uses your church, and the disciples in it, to continue his mission of making disciples, forming disciples, and equipping and sending disciples to transform lives, communities and the world. Help people discover their spiritual gifts, bless them and then unleash them in your congregation and into the mission field that begins right outside the doors of your sanctuary.

Demonstrate the difference Jesus makes. Almost every congregation has figured out how to thrive with a diverse group of people who have perspectives that are diametrically opposed. Don't see this as a problem; see it as a wonderful opportunity to show how Jesus brings together people who normally wouldn't give each other the time of day. Keep people worshiping together on the same pew, praying together, studying together, serving together and caring for each other.

I want to be absolutely clear about something that some people may consider to be a scandalous idea. Yet I am convicted of its truth. The future of your church is not dependent upon what happens in the United Methodist Church. Don't let the uncertainty, or brokenness, paralyze you. Move ahead boldly and confidently. Your church will still be part of the Body of Christ. Your church will still make disciples of Jesus Christ. Your church will still form deeper disciples. And your church will still equip and send disciples to transform lives, communities and the world."

Thank you for the many ways you form disciples and transform the lives of people throughout Central, Clemson, Seneca, and the other places you go. Please continue to be in prayer for all General Conference delegates, for our church, and our community. If you have any questions about General Conference or the denomination, please consider attending the General Conference listening session on February 16 at 3 p.m. at Mauldin UMC. I am always happy to listen, as well. Even in uncertain times, know that I am grateful to be your pastor!


Other upcoming events:

Coming Soon in Worship!




