

Have you heard about ReShape?

We're beginning to come back to church. It's comforting, it's familiar, it's different. As we walk through this next stage of being the church through the pandemic, we've had conversation on *How*:

How do we pick back up? Continue our ministry? Connect in our community? Join in with one another in fellowship? Worship? Share the good news?

Through a shared desire to get started on the right foot, the Church Council discussed different opportunities to develop clarity for Mt. Zion moving forward. We learned about ReShape, a process designed to help churches make decisions following volatile events, which was developed during the COVID-19 pandemic, and involves the entire congregation in developing the goals and mission of the church. It also connects several churches going through the ReShape process at the same time via Zoom conferences, allowing for shared learning experiences. ReShape provides each church with a coach for personalized leadership through the process. Another appealing part of ReShape is the timeline - no dragging our feet; we hit the ground running and will be done before you know it.

The bulk of ReShape happens through small groups. This is how the entire congregation will have the opportunity to be heard. Small group sessions are structured & guided. A leader in each group will gather input from small group conversation. All of your concerns, ideas, and prayers will come together. Resulting goals and plans will reflect where we truly want to go as a church. How amazing is that?!



Seating Diagram Key:

- **Green pews** Social distancing and masking not required in this section once you are seated.
- Yellow pews Please practice social distancing (6 feet between you and other individuals or families), and wear a mask over your mouth and nose)
- **Red pews** Please leave these pews empty to allow for social distancing.

Please note: Please wear a mask over your mouth and nose while finding your seat and exiting, regardless of where you choose to sit.


August worship series

Annual Conference Report

The theme of this year's Annual Conference was "Seeking a More Excellent Way," words to live by in all we do, but especially as followers of Christ. Video reports from all standing committees can be found at https://www.umcsc.org/ac2021/. Here are highlights from the conference:

Most important for us was continuing the assignment of our own Pastor Jonathan to Mt. Zion.

- Established priorities of the church: "Taking the next faithful step;"
 developing leaders, both clergy and lay; engaging our communities
 (Serving); growing disciples; measuring and evaluating realities and
 missional possibilities
- From **Standing Rules:** Tenure of Conference Trustees changed from 2 to 8 years; created procedures for virtual conferences; changed voting procedures so that items can be passed at the end of one day rather than at the end of a multi-day conference; improved nomination procedures
- From Connectional Ministries Committee: Developed "Our Response to Racism" (<u>www.umcsc.org/endracism</u>); added information to Forward Focus re: Covid 19; created a video in response to General Assembly not passing predatory lending proposal last year; began working with other non-profits to encourage passage of this law.
- From Board of Ordained Ministry: Donations requested for scholarships for ministerial students. Any donations should be sent to: Office of the Treasurer, 4980 Colonial Dr., Columbia, SC 29203
- From the Council of Finance and Administration Budget Committee: 87% of the Conference's apportionments were given last year, an exceptional feat in light of COVID-19
- From **Conference Lay Leadership**: Churches were encouraged to contact their district lay leader for help and advice. Jeff Fogle, Anderson District Lay leader, www.umcsc.org/layleadership
