Ash Wednesday



However, all worshippers will no longer be asked to please wear a mask when entering and exiting, and there will be no designated seating sections. As we have throughout the pandemic, Mt. Zion's leaders will continue monitoring statistics from DHEC, guidance from the CDC, and protocols from the South Carolina United Methodist Conference. We celebrate the current circumstances that have allowed us to take this step!

United Methodist Women is Now United Women in Faith



General Conference Postponed Again until 2024

The United Methodist General Conference that was originally scheduled for 2020 and postponed until August, 2022 has now been postponed again until



2024. This global gathering of United Methodists is the decision-making body of our denomination. This means that any denominational decisions over the ordination and marriage of people who are gay will now be made in 2024 at the earliest. Because General Conference is once again so far off, and because it is not clear what decisions (if any) Mt. Zion would potentially need to make, we will wait until closer to the 2024 conference to begin having intentional conversations about how to navigate those decisions in the most loving, faithful way we can. In the meantime, here are three things you can do:

- Please continue to pray for our global church and for the decisions that are ahead for The United Methodist Church.
- Please pray for our brothers and sisters in parts of the world where the COVID-19 pandemic impacts their ability to secure visas for the conference.
- Please remember that, no matter what comes of the 2024 General Conference, our mission until that time and after that time is the same: to make disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.
