Finally, having gone through this time of small group fellowship, I feel our team is better prepared to lead the entire church through the ReShape process in early 2022, so that we might better reconnect in order to discern and follow where God is leading us as we emerge from the pandemic.

I am grateful for this team of leaders who continue to offer their time, energy, and talents out of their love for God and God's church. May this Advent season and upcoming process help each of us be shaped more fully into people who prepare the way for the coming of Christ and his kingdom!

During worship on November 7, we celebrated these 14 veterans who call Mt. Zion their church home. Thank you for your service!


