New Children's Sunday School Class

We are excited to say that we have a growing Children's Ministry, and we need another Children's Sunday School class. We would like to split our children into two classes, a younger and an older. Right now in the one class we have children from Kindergarten through 5th grade. The good news is that we have the space and the curriculum for this transition. The other good news is that the children need you! We have talked as a church about how we want to grow the children's ministry and we want people to be more involved, and this opportunity has both. We are looking for four sets of teachers for each class. The teachers will teach for a month and then have three months off. Having this many teachers also means that there are plenty of back-ups. As of the writing of this, we have at least one person in 5 of the 8 slots for the two Sunday School classes. I want to encourage you to sign up and help if you are able. You don't have to be great with children, you just have to love them and want to share with them. Even Preacher Gene is signing up for a rotation.

Report on the S.C. Annual Conference The United Methodist Church (Making Space for God to Work)

As an elected delegate by Mount Zion United Methodist Church, I along with Rev. Gene Aiken, attended the S.C. Annual Conference of the United Methodist Church. It was held in Florence, South Carolina on **June 5-8, 2016.** This was a new experience for me making it very interesting to learn about the politics and interactions of our conference.

On day one, Sunday, most of the day was spent traveling, but I was able to attend orientation and the opening worship service held in the main coliseum. In orientation, we learned about procedures on reports, recommendations, resolutions and petitions. Worship began at 7:30pm led by Bishop L. Jonathan Holston. His message ,"Just One More Thing", was very moving and inspired me to think about doing one more thing for God and my church. The service was ended by a touching and somber communion service.

On day two, Monday, we started with a service of word and table. The Rev. Jason Everson delivered the message, "Playing in the Dirt", followed by communion. Most of the day was spent covering the election of officers, finance and resolutions. The resolutions were presented during the day which I will cover later. The evening service was a Commissioning and Ordination Service presided by Bishop Holston. Rev. Michael Goldston was among the candidates ordained.

On day three, Tuesday, we started with a service of word and table. The Rev. Geneva Stafford brought the message "It's for the Lord's Glory" followed by communion. Many reports were given throughout the day on Connectional Ministries, Hispanic Ministry, Congregational Development and Imagine No Malaria, just to name a few. There was also a service to recognize retiring ministers titled "Passing of the Mantle". In the evening there was a concert for Imagine No Malaria where Rev. Gene Aiken presented our check from Mt. Zion's congregation.

On day four, Wednesday, we started with a service of word and table. The Rev. David L. Anderson delivered the message "A Second Chance" followed by communion. Wednesday is the day in which voting occurs on items such as the consent agenda and resolutions. Everything passed including three resolutions, a Resolution for an Assessment, and Plan of Action for the African American Historical Methodist Flagship Churches of the S.C. Annual Conference, Responsibilities for Eradication of Racism Resolution and Resolution to oppose Discrimination Against Transgender People. It took a little over two hours to work through these resolutions. There was a sad note in that 11 church charges were dissolved in South Carolina including one in the Anderson district, the North Anderson Charge. And on a good note Rev. Gene Aiken was appointed to Mt. Zion next year. We then adjourned, Amen

Thank you for your support in allowing me to represent our congregation this year. Ed Martin.
