The conference actually voted to write a check immediately for \$5000 per ministry to the 15 different groups we support using “left over funds”. A few of these ministries include The Alston Wilkes Society, Rural Mission, Inc., and Killingsworth, Inc. A complete listing of additional groups is available in conference material should you care to review it. Immigration reform was once again a topic of concern since both governmental agencies and religious affiliated groups have such varied opinions as to how to alleviate or rectify this situation. We were urged to get involved and become knowledgeable regarding this issue.

if “we were up for the challenge” of being these disciples? Many times this question was hurled with fiery tongue and loud proclamation. While other times, he simply looked you in the eye, figuratively speaking of course, and dared to probe. Your unspoken response typically brought emotion and humbleness regardless of his method of delivery.

Bible Study involved a daily walk through history for a woman of the Bible by Dr. Vivian Fowler, Vice President of Academic Affairs at Wesleyan College. Her focus was to help us discern how the life of a woman was totally dependent on her family, spouse, and the dowry she possessed. Dr. Fowler’s delivery was emotional and forthcoming with intricate details of a female such as Elizabeth in the book of Luke and the women referred to throughout Deuteronomy. Needless to say, life was never easy for the females of a home or family. Dr. Fowler summed up their life by praying, “I don’t understand faith, but I have it. I do not understand Jesus, but I love him.” I hope these vows ring true for each of us in our walk to be disciples of Jesus Christ through our living, giving, and serving regardless of being male or female.

On a business note, the pension plans, and changes to retirement and insurance discussed in depth last year were much improved as a result of the many heated declarations made at the 2012 conference. The voices were definitely heard and the committee worked diligently to meet the budget while solving coverage issues for all positions within the clergy. One specific change is that deductible amounts were raised rather than totally eliminating coverage for specific retirees or part time clergy. Part time ministers do have changes, but are not totally eliminated from pension plans or insurance options as previously planned.

Bishop Holston’s experience and demeanor were definitely felt during the resolution presentations of the business meetings. He would constantly remind members that we were in attendance in Christian faith and constantly interjected precisely delivered humor and light heartedness. He never allowed debates or discussions to become a contest of wit or language. In the past, the number of words one used to describe or debate an issue often muddled the water, and left participants wondering what the original issue really had been. Bishop Holston has a dynamic personality, larger than average presence, and he uses these attributes to manage and encourage others with “pizzazz”. Can’t say that I have used that word to describe Annual Conference before, have I?
