God's Special Time

It's a little late to be writing an article about Kairos cookies, but they say hindsight is 20/20. I am guilty. I did not bake any cookies. I had good intentions, but I "forgot". You now—how you really intend to do something—especially when they are talking about it during a circle meeting or when you read the write-up in the bulletin. To make it even worse, I looked at my calendar on Monday and noticed my notation for Tuesday, the 23rd., "9:30...Cookies to Church...Kairos" written in the little block. I'll bake them this afternoon—but then I "forgot". I was just too busy.

Today, working on this newsletter, I wanted to make sure I was spelling Kairos correctly, so I did a search on Google for "Kairos cookies". Here's what popped up: [WHY BAKE COOKIES FOR KAIROS? - Kairos of South Carolina](#). So I clicked on it—and then the guilt washed over me.

The article says that each team takes a bag of cookies to each person in their dorm, cottage or cell block. Residents (prisoners) who have already experienced a Kairos weekend, bag the cookies and put a verse of scripture in each bag. The next paragraph is what really got to me.

"These cookies tell the residents that someone who doesn't know them still cares enough to give a part of their life—the time it takes to bake the cookies—without wanting something in return."... "Someone has said that these cookies are 'seeds of love' being sown in the hearts of those who know so little of the love God's children are commanded to show..."

It was then that I realized that not only did I not provide any cookies, but I did not provide any seeds of love. I am ashamed that I "forgot", that I was too "busy".

I'm glad Jesus didn't "forget" me. He wasn't too "busy" or "scared" to die for my sins. Next year I promise that I am going to do better.
