Earlier this year we were invited to join with several other United Methodist churches in the area working together to raise money for a worthy cause, purchasing an ark of animals for Heifer International. This ark means two (or more) of every Heifer animal - oxen, donkeys, water buffalo, cows, sheep, goats, bees, chicks, rabbits and more healthy, hardy animals that will go forth and multiply. The cost of this ark is \$5,000 and our church's goal is to raise \$500 by the end of December.

Heifer International's mission is to work with communities to end hunger and poverty and care for the earth. They give families a hand-up, not just a hand-out, and empower them to turn lives of hunger and poverty into selfreliance and hope.

Through gifts of livestock and training, Heifer projects help families improve their nutrition and generate income in sustainable ways. They refer to the animals as "living loans" because in exchange for their livestock and training, families agree to give one of its animal's offspring to another family in need. It's called "Passing on the Gift" - a cornerstone of their mission that creates an ever -expanding network of hope and peace.

November is typically a month when we count our blessings as we observe Thanksgiving. I hope we will be able to raise at least \$500 so we can bless others as we have been blessed.

NATIONAL COLLECTION WEEK: NOVEMBER 12-19, 2012

- 1. **SHOE BOX** Use an empty shoe box (standard size, please) or a small plastic container. You can wrap the box (lid separately), but wrapping is not required. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.

Also good to include are school supplies and hygiene items. **Do not** include used or damaged items; war-related items such as guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids; medications or vitamins; aerosol cans or breakable items such as glass containers or snowglobes.
- 4. **INCLUDE \$7 DONATION** Please donate \$7 or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs. You can give online (https://www.samaritanspurse.org/index.php/OCC/followyourbox/) or click on this link: "Follow Your Box Donation" option, or you can write a check to Samaritan's Purse (note "OCC" on memo line) and place it in an envelope on top of the gift items inside your box. If you or your family are preparing more than one shoe box, please make one combined donation.
- 5. **DROP OFF** Place a rubber band around each closed shoe box and bring it to **church by Sunday, November 18** or drop it off at the collection center nearest you (Clemson Presbyterian Church) during collection week, November 12-19, 2012.

Report on Updates and Maintenance at the Church and Parsonage

The following are the items that have been completed at the church.

- Nursery painted, new flooring, Dutch door made from existing door, new furniture
- Shelving added to closet outside of nursery
- Three Sunday school rooms (K-6) painted and new furniture
- Adult Sunday school room painted, new carpeting, blinds
- Youth Sunday school room painted
- Outside at back corner of the church the area was cleaned out and a weed barrier put down and new mulch added. Two drain spouts extended and also extended air conditioner pipes (air return) for proper drainage away from the church. The drainage ditch lined with weed block and gravel was added to the ditch.
- Maintenance on all HVAC systems was completed this summer.
- Parking lot extended and paved to allow for more parking. Existing parking lot resurfaced and restriped.
- Sidewalk added to north side of the church to existing steps and new railings added alongside the existing steps.

The following are the items that have been completed at the parsonage.

- Blinds were added to the kitchen windows and kitchen door.
- A new patio screen ordered and installed for oversized patio door.
- Drapes added to the patio door and den window.
- New cushions made for outside wicker furniture.
- The master bath was completely renovated and the second bathroom had several updates made to it.
- A new entry hall light fixture in foyer and new microwave oven for kitchen.

And finally, a new lawn care company was put on retainer to maintain the church and parsonage lawns.

With everyone's help and assistance, it has truly been a good year for us at Mt. Zion. Thanks to all of you for your commitment to help in these matters of the church. God has blessed us in so many ways this past year. We are so thankful for His watchful eye on us.
