

Thank You!!! to all those who are currently serving or have served in the military. Veteran's Day is November 11th. We especially want to thank Mt. Zion's two World War II veterans: Bill Clayton and Wes Witcher. We appreciate what they have done for their country and Mt. Zion UMC.

William T. Clayton, or Bill as we know him, was born in 1925 in the white house right next door to Mt. Zion. His grandparents and father were charter members when this church building was built; with his mother soon to follow, when she married and moved to Central. World War II interrupted his college years at Clemson. Bill enlisted in the army and served in the European theatre, including the Battle of the Bulge. When the war ended, Bill returned and finished his undergraduate degree in Agronomy and earned a master's degree in Animal


Husbandry. Eventually he took over the family farm while working as a letter carrier for one of Central's mail routes. During this time Bill and his wife, Sara, served on many committees at Mt. Zion. He was a Lay Speaker for a number of years, not only filling in when Mt. Zion's pastor was away, but also for other pastors in our district. Bill served on the Pickens County Planning Commission for 35 years. Due to health concerns Bill has spent most of his time in the past few years with his daughter, Susan, and her family in Atlanta. However, he loves to come back to the farm and to worship at Mt. Zion. He cherishes getting the bulletin and newsletters and encourages everyone to read about the "wonderful, wonderful things that are happening at Mt. Zion.



Wesley "Wes" Witcher, was born in 1923 on a tobacco farm near Whittles Depot, Virginia. World War II interrupted his studies at Ferrum Junior College and in 1943 he volunteered for the Army Air Corps (which later became the Air Force) as an aviation student. After graduating as a 2nd Lieutenant Pilot, he was sent for training in Arkansas and then to Waco, Texas, as a pilotinstructor where he was placed on Secret Orders for overseas deployment. He eventually went to Biak in the Southwest Pacific Area and drew assignment to a radar calibration detachment. Wes flew 45 combat missions in the South Pacific before the war was over. He was released from active duty in November of 1945, but stayed in the reserves until 1972 when he retired as a Lieutenant Colonel in the National Guard AA Artillery (now known as Air Defense Artillery). Resuming his studies at Virginia Tech, he completed a BS in forestry and eventually, a Ph.D. in plant pathology at NC State. In 1960 he moved to Clemson to accept the position as Forest Pathologist at Clemson University. He served in this capacity for 17 years, changed to Vegetable Pathologist for the next 11 years, and retired in 1988. About that time, he had moved the family to a 20-acre farm in Six Mile where he grew and sold peaches for 20+ years. He moved his membership from Clemson UMC to Mt. Zion. Through the years he has served on many committees, was chairmen of Church Council, taught Sunday School, and sang bass in the choir. (He "probably" had something to do

with his son-in-law, Ron Goldstein, becoming our current pianist.) His carpentry skills have been shared in projects such as our Habitat for Humanity house, construction of the platform and railing around the organ (when it was moved out of the choir loft) and, most recently, making the little "windows" in the nursery/classroom doors to bring our building up to Safe Sanctuary standards. He just retired from the choir this year, so now look for him in one of the pews. In his words: "I love everyone in church. You have been very good to me."

(Wes and Shirley still live on their farm in Six Mile, which is currently for sale as they look to downsize.)

I've got a confession to make to you. I've never been to a charge conference before. I didn't go when I was growing up at St. John's UMC in Aiken. I never went when I was away at college or in the Navy. I didn't even go when St. John's "examined and recommended" me for candidacy for ordination, as I was living in New Orleans at the time. November 16 will be the first charge conference I've ever attended, and now I'm the administrative officer! Now, I wish I had been there to share in our connection. Officially, charge conference is "the basic unit of the connectional system" of The United Methodist Church (*Book of Discipline*, 2012, paragraph 246.1). It is the meeting that makes our spiritual connection in the Holy Spirit to all Christians in our denomination more physical and concrete. Very often we hear about events and ministries of the South Carolina Conference or the General Boards of our denomination. Charge conference is our opportunity to communicate back with the rest of the denomination all of the great things God is doing at Mt. Zion in Central.

The stated responsibility of the charge conference is to "review and evaluate the total mission and ministry of the church...and adopt objectives and goals," (Book of Discipline, 2012, paragraph 247.3). This is our chance as a community in Christ to get together and talk about this past year. What were our successes to celebrate? What were our failures to learn from? In the reports and discussion, we discern our way forward into the bright future of our coming Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. We elect leadership for the upcoming year and look forward to the new and changing ways that God will call us to God's mission to be God's people in the world.

Have you, like me, never been to charge conference before? You are invited. Been to them all? You are invited, too. You've never been to THIS charge conference. "They" told me that charge conference is just another boring meeting, but I don't know any better, so we can do it differently! Expenses were high for the quarter due to our replacing one air conditioning unit at the church and having to remove 2 trees from the property. In addition to the above income and expenses we funded our support to Epworth \$635; Aldersgate \$339; the sound system upgrade, \$704; and dining room furniture for the parsonage, \$750. With our gifting remaining below our budgeted level, we will continue to monitor our finances closely.
